## A BEGINNING WELL-MADE, NOW NEEDS MORE HANDS.

**Helping Hand Foundation** is one of the premier health care charity in the country and certainly one of the largest in the south. Established **18** years back in **2007**, HHF today is aiming to bridge health inequities for the marginalised sections through its well thought out and robust interventions.

Strengthening access to public health systems, taking primary health care closest to the most vulnerable sections in Urban, Peri-Urban and Rural areas, apart from focusing on Institutional Care like free dialysis, rehabilitation & geriatric care with a community centric approach has been our mainstay.

Our Gross Receipts for the year **2024** stood at **₹23.16 Crores with a growth of 20% Year-over-Year (YOY)**.

We touched **8 lac lives** through direct benefit mode and another **15 lacs lives** through other interventions.

Our health outreach impacts **35%** of the Urban Poor and translates cumulatively into a saving of **₹100 Crores** of out-of-pocket expenses.

This reduces financial shocks and prevents people from slipping into poverty. It also mitigates morbidity and lowers mortality as we are catching disease early for many.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### HEALTH GREIVENCES ADDRESSAL SYSTEM

**PRAJA DARBAR, Rajendarnagar, Hyderabad**



HHF since its inception in **2007** has opened its doors to the public to bring their health-related grievances. A dedicated team of counsellors manages the Front desk where **30-50** patients visit the desk located in the head office of the foundation. A health App is used to record the grievance and put the data into the system. The team then provides the solution for grievance either by linking the patient to the public health system or the partner private hospitals and at times some medical emergency cases require cash assistance which is promptly provided to these patients round the year.

More importantly the team does close monitoring after the patient leaves and follows it up closely until the patient completes the treatment. Guidance and handholding are done at every step of the process. Till date over **1 million patients** have visited our Praja Darbar which is open from **09:00 am to 05:00 pm (Mon-Sat)** for the past **18 years**.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### HELP DESK IN GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS REFERRAL PATHWAYS FOR REDUCING INEQUITY



HHF Help Desk Systems in over **12 Tertiary Hospitals** with a single vision to connect the economically weaker sections in leveraging public health for free treatment. These are referral pathways from Primary to tertiary care seamlessly. The Help Desk are also the face of the large monolith govt hospitals and act as bridge to connect the common for social good.

**15.8K+** patients were counselled and linked to Govt hospital in 2024 & we estimate that these efforts have saved patients over **₹43.33 Cr** in out-of-pocket expenses that they would have otherwise incurred and borrowed due to the high costs in private hospitals. Further over **15 lacs** patients were provided invaluable guidance, navigational support along with mobility assistance in the govt hospitals.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### HHF 12 FREE PRIMARY HEALTHCARE CENTERS















HHF along with its partner charities is providing community centric comprehensive primary health care across **90+** highly remote and vulnerable Urban and Peri Urban Slums in the city of Hyderabad with a population coverage of about **10** lacs plus.

This year our total OPD stood at **5.52 lacs** i.e. we reached out to almost 35% of the Urban poor of the city. With our Universal health care model of provisioning promotive, preventive, curative and palliative care services this translated to out of pocket savings of **₹44.35** Crores collectively. High quality Primary Health Services not only improved health prevented disease & financial shocks due to adverse health events but also improved other social indices of the Urban poor.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### HHF Rural Health Program



HHF, in collaboration with Wipro Cares, operates a Rural Community Centric Comprehensive Primary Health Care Program in **11 villages**, serving **19.7k** residents. This community-centric initiative integrates promotive, preventive, and curative healthcare, ensuring timely treatment at villagers' doorsteps.

A household health survey identifies sick and vulnerable individuals, connecting them to rural clinics held twice a week in each village. This approach has significantly improved access to timely and affordable healthcare, especially for those with chronic illnesses like Diabetes, Hypertension and cardiac which are rising rapidly in rural areas due to limited local health facilities.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### HHF-SEED: PIONEERING FREE DIALYSIS SERVICES SINCE 2022



Since its inception, HHF-SEED has provided **4768 free dialysis sessions**, saving patients **₹1.43 Crores** in medical expenses. Beyond financial relief, this initiative supports young breadwinners, enabling them to care for their families without the burden of costly treatment. Our hygienic, corporate-style facility, managed by a skilled medical team, ensures quality care at zero cost, offering dignity and hope to those in need.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### REHABILITATION & GERIATRIC CARE (Not for Profit)

**40-Bedded** Not-for-Profit Rehabilitation Centre committed to providing high-quality rehab care at minimal costs, has made a significant impact. This year alone, **228 patients** suffering from post-stroke complications, trauma, tracheostomy cases, and mental health disorders have received specialized care. With an Out-of-Pocket Expenditure (OOPE) of **₹88 lacs**, we continue to offer affordable and effective rehabilitation to those in need.



### HOME FOR THE AGED (A Free Old-Age home for All)



HHF has been running a decent **40-bedded home** for the aged since 2021. The facility offers a homely and hygienic environment for geriatrics at no cost to the patient.

The center is managed by a well-trained supervisor along with nurses, helpers, support staff round the clock. A general physician visits the home every alternate day. Destitute old people who are abandoned by their families find this their second home.

**87 patients** served this year and have resulted in a saving of **₹53.10 Lacs**

## AMBULANCE & FUNERAL SERVICES

HHF, runs **10 Ambulances** for providing patient transport from its health centres to Government hospitals. More importantly, many patients who die in government hospitals and who are either homeless or without family to perform their last rites regardless of caste or creed, get help from our volunteers, who have conducted **18 funerals** at shamshans, graveyards, cemeteries for the homeless and destitute.

## OUR FLAGSHIP PROGRAMS

### SEED-HHF FREE PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR MIGRANT LABOURERS



SEED-HHF has transformed the lives of first-generation students by establishing the city's first **100%** free primary school, dedicated to children from migrant labour families. So far, **498** vulnerable children have been admitted. The school provides free transport, books, uniforms and mid-day meal to the students. This year, we spent **₹30.05 lakhs** and saved **₹1.09 crores** on education costs for these children.

## DIRECT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### FREE BONE MARROW TRANSPLANTS MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH HHF



Bone Marrow Transplants (BMTs) are typically very expensive and beyond the reach of middle-class and lower-middle-class patients. However, through **Helping Hand Foundation (HHF)**, in collaboration with **MNJ Cancer Institute, Hyderabad**, we have made BMTs accessible to those in need.

In 2024, we successfully supported and assisted **Four BMT procedures**, spent **10 lacs** and saving patients and their families approximately **₹1.0 Crore in Out-of-Pocket Expenses (OOPE)**.

## NEW INITIATIVES

### COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM HEALTH, RELIEF & REHAB (A Kin to NHS, UK Model)



HHF identifies and supports sole bread earners, widows, and abandoned women facing health and social challenges. Our dedicated team of counsellors, paramedics, and physiotherapists works on the ground, following a model like the NHS (UK).

Counsellors assess patients clinical, social, and hygiene needs, offering daily support. Acute cases are linked to public health facilities, while physiotherapists provide home-based care. Social aid, including food, rent, and education for children, is also provided. A specialized team works with abandoned women, single mothers, and orphans, ensuring vulnerable children are enrolled in schools for continued education.

More than **400 beneficiaries** have been supported this year, and we continue to reach and help more individuals in need.

## NEW INITIATIVES

### CITY'S FIRST DEMENTIA CLINIC FOR THE URBAN POOR



HHF, in collaboration with Asha Hospital Trust & Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Society of India (ARDSI), has initiated Hyderabad's first Dementia Clinic at the Primary Health Care level. This initiative ensures early diagnosis, specialized care, and support for underprivileged dementia patients and their families.

## NEW INITIATIVES

### LACTATION MANAGEMENT CENTERS IN URBAN SLUMS



HHF is running **5 Lactation Management Centres** in urban slums to support maternal and infant healthcare among disadvantaged communities. Despite the National Guidelines **(2018)** by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, recommending such centres in public health facilities, their implementation has been lacking.

HHF's initiative fills this crucial gap by providing dedicated and hygienic spaces for lactating mothers. These centres aim to promote and facilitate breastfeeding, ensuring newborns receive essential nutrition in environments where proper lactation support is often inadequate.

More than **1,690 breastfeeding women** have benefited from this program this year.

## NEW INITIATIVES

### 20-BED FREE INPATIENT WARD (24X7) FOR TROPICAL & INFECTIOUS DISEASES



HHF, in collaboration with AMPI-USA, has established a first-of-its-kind **20-bed Hospital for Tropical & Infectious Diseases**, along with a **5-bed Emergency Casualty Unit** in Shaheen Nagar Slum. This **24x7 facility** is equipped with top-quality medical care, staffed by round-the-clock doctors and nurses, ensuring comprehensive treatment for vulnerable communities. Since its inception, **754 inpatients** have been successfully treated free of cost.

## NEW INITIATIVES

### HHF HELPDESK AT SAROJINI DEVI EYE HOSPITAL



HHF, in collaboration with **Govt. Sarojini Devi Eye Hospital**, launched Help Desk Services to assist hundreds of patients with eye ailments and vision impairment. **3 trained counsellors** are stationed at the OPD Help Desk to guide and support patients. Since its launch, the Help Desk has been assisting **1200-1400 patients** daily, making hospital visits smoother and more efficient.

### FREE PSYCHOTHERAPY & PHYSIOTHERAPY FOR BEDRIDDEN PATIENTS AT THEIR DOORSTEP



HHF's Community Outreach Program provides free Psychotherapy and Physiotherapy services to immobile and bedridden patients, ensuring access to vital rehabilitation. Additionally, HHF's Mental Health Counsellors offer community-level support for those battling depression and loneliness, having successfully counselled **28 patients** with suicidal tendencies.

### EXPANDING ACCESS TO LIFESAVING HEALTHCARE HHF'S NEW PARTNERSHIPS

HHF has expanded its free healthcare services through strategic partnerships to provide high-quality, accessible medical care for the underprivileged. Under the **HHF-Renova Hospitals** tie-up, poor patients can now avail cashless cardiac surgeries and procedures. These treatments will be covered under **Aarogyasri**, with HHF taking care of co-payments, ensuring that financial constraints do not hinder critical heart care.

HHF has partnered with **Apollo Institute of Medical Sciences & Research (AIMSR)** to offer free Outpatient Services, affordable NICU/PICU treatments, free Pediatric Cardiac Surgeries under Aarogyasri, and free C-sections and normal deliveries. These initiatives aim to provide lifesaving treatments to those who cannot afford expensive medical care.
